

3 • *A Piece Of The Action*

Event

Crime. Plays in your core. When an opponent completes a mission, if your Smuggler personnel or your personnel with 2 Acquisition is at that mission, you may remove this event from the game to score 10 points.

"I figure it's got to be a thick percentage or you wouldn't be trying to hit Krako."

1 • *A Question of Faith*

Event

Prophet. Plays in your core. At the end of each of your turns you may stop your Kai or personnel with 2 Honor to discard a card from hand. Until the start of your next turn, opponent's cards cannot remove cards of the same type as that card in your discard pile from the game.

"Prophecy can often be vague, Commander. That's why we must test it."

5 • *Blood Oath*

Event

Assault. Plays in your core.
Order - Destroy this event to begin combat involving your personnel with 2 Honor or 2 Leadership. If you win, score 10 points and choose an opponent's personnel involved to be killed.

"This time, we will reach the Albino. And when we do, I will cut his heart out and eat it while he watches me with his dying breath."

6 • *Commandeer Ship*

Event

Crime. To play this event, lose 5 points. Plays in your core. At the start of each of your turns, if you command a personnel with 2 Programming aboard an opponent's unstaffed ship, you may remove this event from the game to take command of that ship. (That ship becomes the same affiliation as that personnel.)

0 • *Legally Arrested*

Event

Capture. Plays in your core.
Order - Destroy this event, lose 5 points, and stop your personnel with 2 Law or 2 Security to choose an opponent's personnel present with that personnel to be placed in your brig.

"Under article number one hundred and eighty-four of your Interstellar Law, I'm placing you under arrest."

2 • *Metaphasic Shields*

Event

Plays in your core. While you have a personnel with 2 Astrometrics aboard your ship, that ship is Shields +3. While you have a personnel with 2 Science aboard your ship, that ship is Shields +3.
